Many educators do not have the summer “off.” Maintenance and grounds staff, most administrators and directors, and some clerical staff work throughout the summer. These SISD employees work an extended contract beyond the normal school calendar.

The Springtown Area Chamber of Commerce is pleased to announce the first Mr. Senior Springtown Recognition Program. The program's goal is to draw attention to the achievements of the senior gentlemen in our community. It is also meant to celebrate the strength of today's senior man and acknowledge his accomplishments. It will emphasize that the true meaning of success comes from within oneself.

To nominate your husband, father, grandfather, uncle, or your friend, submit an essay (200 words or less) explaining why you feel he deserves this honor. The essay can come from anyone including children. They do not have to be formal but remember that these essays will be read by a group of judges who will narrow them down to five worthy candidates. The final five will attend a sit-down interview with a second group of judges; this process will determine the winner. The top five will be announced publicly following the interview; however, Mr. Senior Springtown 2011 will not be revealed until the Chamber of Commerce Luncheon on July 28th.

The rules:

- (1) Nominees must be at least 60 years of age on July 9, 2011;
- (2) Nominees must reside within the Springtown School District or 76082 zip code;
- (3) Compose an essay consisting of 200 words or less and submit it to the Springtown Area Chamber of Commerce.

The essay should include:

- (1) Full name of the nominee*
- (2) Full contact information of nominee*
- (3) Full contact information of the person submitting the essay*
- (4) Birth date of the nominee*

*Essays submitted without this information will not be considered

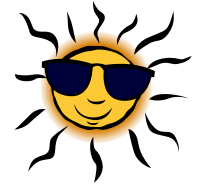
Guidelines for essay:

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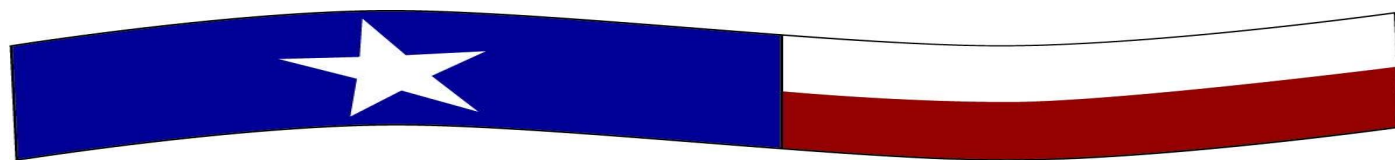
